Invite you to take part in a very unique and one off 1916 historical event in the town of Navan. With a parade led by the Cabra Historical Society, an acclaimed 1916 re-enactment group, marching bands and enjoy a short drama depicting Navan events in 1916.

There will be two starting points:

All are encouraged to dress in period costume.

Residents and groups from the Johnstown area will leave Buvinda House (old Quinn Building) in Johnstown at 2.30pm and will join the main parade on the Fairgreen at 3pm.

All other residents and groups to meet at the Fairgreen in Navan on Sunday 5th June 2016 at 3.00pm

At 3.15pm a photograph will be taken, recreating a famous image of Irish Volunteers assembled on the Fairgreen in 1914.

This will be followed by the parade continuing up to the Mercy roundabout, Railway Street, Trimgate St and the Square, ending on Watergate Street at 3.45pm with a theatrical on street re-enactment of an incident as reported in the Meath Chronicle on 5<sup>th</sup> June 1916.

All proceedings will be finished by 4.15pm for parent's collection. It would be lovely for non-parade participants to line the route waving flags and cheering on the parade.
