Big Book Club Book Quiz



Francis Ledwidge Centenary 1917 - 2017

As part of the centenary commemoration artwork from the graphic novel *Francis Ledwidge, Ireland's Soldier Poet* will be on display in Meath libraries in the coming months. The work opens with quotes from Seamus Heaney's poem, "In Memoriam Francis Ledwidge" (1979), and is a biographical account of Ledwidge's life in graphic form. This series was originally produced by the Nerve Centre, Derry as part of their Creative Centenaries project offering an insight into the lives of renowned Irish poets in relation to the Easter Rising and the First World War.

Creative Ireland Meath held a public consultation meeting on 11th April 2017 at the Solstice Arts Centre, Navan, with an open meeting and discussion in the company of the Creative Ireland national team.



from Ms Costello's class in St. Joseph's Mercy Primary School went wild for jungle storytime in Navan library.


Create a Cushion






Summer events for children
