Brenda Castles from Summerhill, is from a rich tradition of music, having learned concertina from Rena Traynor (née Crotty) & Mícheál Ó'Raghallaigh. She has a series of All Ireland Fleadh titles to her name both in solo and group competitions. Music has brought her around the world to far flung destinations including Hong Kong, Mongolia and Iceland. Brenda has just returned from a series of concerts in New York and is currently based in Dublin city centre, where she regularly performs and teaches music. Brenda launched her debut fourteen track album, 'Indeedin You Needn't Bother', in early 2017.

Bernadette Nic Gabhann comes from a musical family in Ashbourne, and has travelled the world playing fiddle and promoting Irish Arts. She learned to play at home from her father Antóin Mac Gabhann, a home known for its annual house dances & live RTE Céili House broadcasts. Participating successfully in Fleadhanna Cheoil in her youth, Bernadette then toured as Fiddle player with Troupe 2 of 'Michael Flatley's Lord of the Dance'. She is also a member of the acclaimed transatlantic group 'NicGaviskey'.
