Máire Ní Raghallaigh, born in Drumconrath village in 1867 was a noted Irish language enthusiast. Deeply involved in Conradh na Gaeilge, she was party to the setting up of a branch in Naas in 1900. In 1903 she was one of the organisers of an Aeridheacht held there at which Padraic Pearse spoke. In 1916 she opened an Irish bookshop in 87 Upper Dorset St., and in 1917 is photographed outside her shop with Mrs Pearse.
