JOHNSTOWN COMMUNITY FACILITY:

Summary of Community Survey Results



October 2017







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1 Introduction

1.1 Context

Meath County Council seeks to improve the recreation and community amenities available to the residents of the Johnstown area. In this regard, Future Analytics Consulting Ltd. (FAC) of 23 Fitzwilliam Square (South), Dublin 2, on behalf of Meath County Council has undertaken a Johnstown community-wide household survey to ascertain an appreciation of the needs of the community, specifically relating to community recreation amenities.

Community consultation was undertaken by means of a survey, which was developed jointly by Meath County Council and Future Analytics Consulting (FAC). The survey was distributed to over 3,000 households within the Johnstown area and available to complete via a physical hard copy or alternatively, via the online version of the survey which was accessible through the online platform *SurveyMonkey*. Public consultation was also undertaken in the Johnstown Shopping Centre, Johnstown over the course of two days in October to engage local residents further in the consultation process. Residents of the Johnstown area were also able to complete the survey during these shopping centre public engagement sessions.

The results of the surveys were compiled and analysed by FAC. This report summarises the responses from all survey responses received by Meath County Council. Appendices 1-3 comprise the results of each of the survey results according to collection method i.e. online submissions, postal and shopping centre.

2 Johnstown Community Survey

In order to understand the needs of the community in terms of what amenities and facilities local residents in the Johnstown area state are needed, a survey was developed and distributed amongst residents of the Johnstown area. The survey was distributed via a number of different streams in order to access as wide a number of recipients as possible, and in doing so, get as much feedback as possible from local residents living in Johnstown.

A physical hard copy of the survey was distributed to ca. 3,000 households in the Johnstown area. Members of the public were given two options with respect to completing the survey – completing the physical survey and returning it to Meath County Council or alternatively, completing the survey online. The online survey was accessible through the online platform *SurveyMonkey* and was open to the public for a period of approximately eight weeks.

FAC held community consultation and information sessions in the Johnstown Shopping Centre over two separate days on Wednesday 4th October 2017 (10:30 to 14:30 hours) and Saturday, 7th October 2017 (10:30 to 14:30 hours). Members of the public were invited to engage with representatives of FAC on the proposed project and complete a survey, had they not already done so.

The survey was publicised via a broad range of media streams, including the Meath County Council 'News and Events' website page; Johnstown Times – community online magazine, community Facebook groups, Twitter, as well as flyers and through local community and sporting groups.

- In total, 570 survey responses were received.
- 469 online survey responses were received between the 24th July and the 20th September 2017.
- 56 physical survey responses were returned to Meath County Council.
- 47 physical surveys were completed via the Johnstown Shopping Centre consultation and information sessions.

3 Summary of the Johnstown Community Survey

The following summarises the results of the Johnstown Community Survey.

- In total, there were 572 responses to the survey, of which 66% were from female respondents.
- Over 50% of respondents were in the 40-64 age bracket, followed by respondents in the 18-39 age cohort.




Figure 1 Breakdown of respondents by age cohort

- 76% of respondents live in households of 3 persons or more.
- 9% (53) of respondents' report having a disability / reduced mobility / or health problems.
- 86% (490) of respondents do not use a community recreation centre.




Figure 2 Activities undertaken by the respondents who currently use a community recreation centre

- Of the 14% of respondents that use a community recreation centre, over 50% use it for 'sports and fitness' purposes, while 11% use it for 'youth activities', as outlined in Figure 2. 89% of these use a car to travel to their centre of choice as the majority travel to centres that are in excess of 10 minutes travel time.




Figure 3 Reasons given why respondents do not use a community recreation centre

Of the 490 respondents that do not use a community recreation centre, the reasons for not using a
community recreation centre are outlined in Figure 3 below. As is clearly evident, the main reason for
respondents not using a community recreation centre is due to there being no such centre in their local
area.




Figure 4 The type of facilities that respondents stated they would like in their community

• The survey asked respondents to identify the type of facilities that they would like to see in their community. Figure 4 outlines the responses in order of preference.

Respondents state that weekday – evenings are the preferred usage times.




Figure 5 Preferred usage times




Figure 6 Volunteering at the local community recreation centre

• The survey asked if members of the public would be interested in volunteering at their local community recreation centre. 63% (302) of respondents indicated that they would be interested in volunteering in some capacity (see Figure 6).

• Of these interested in volunteering, with 'reception duties' and 'organising community events' the preferred choices.




Figure 7 The type of activities that respondents indicated that they would be interested in participating in their local community centre


4 Key Survey Findings

- There was a total of 572 responses to the Johnstown community survey.
- 86% of all respondents do not use a community recreation centre of any kind. The reasons given by respondents for not using a community recreation centre is due to there being no such centre in their local area.
- Of the 14% of respondents that currently use a community recreation centre, over 50% use it for 'sports and fitness' purposes, while 11% use it for 'youth activities'. 89% of these use a car to travel to their centre of choice as the majority travel to centres that are in excess of 10 minutes travel time.
- Respondents outlined their preferences for a community recreation types in which a playground topped the list, followed by (2) a youth centre, (3) health & fitness facility, (4) indoor sporting amenity, (5) family activity and (6) an outdoor sporting facility. This information is very valuable as its indicates the type of facilities preferred by local Johnstown residents. Indeed five out of the top six facilities involve sporting, health or fitness related facilities. However, there is also strong support for facilities such as an 'older person drop-in centre', 'community meeting space', adult education classes' and 'parent and toddler groups'. This would indicate suitability for a multi-use centre and grounds, which can incorporate a variety of these facilities.
- Respondents state that weekday evenings are the preferred usage times. This is likely to accommodate those working during the day or at full time education. However, as indicated, there is demand for morning and afternoon and would accommodate other users such as full-time homemakers, retirees, job seekers and those in part-time employment.
- 63% (302) of respondents indicated that they would be interested in volunteering in some capacity.

Q1. Gender


Of the 469 respondents, 310 (66%) were female and 159 (34%) were male.



Q2. What is your age?

Five categories of age were established:

- 1. 12 years and under
- 2. 13 to 17
- 3. 18 to 39
- 4. 40 to 64
- 5. 65 years and older
- 51% (240 respondents) were aged 40-64 years representing the age category with the largest number of respondents.
- 42% (198 respondents) were aged 18-39 years and represented the second largest age category of respondents.
- With respect to gender and age, 50% (156) of females fall into the 40-64 category, while 46% (141) are in the 18-39 category.
- As for male respondents, 53% of male respondents were between the ages 40 to 64, 36% were 18 to 39, and 5% 13 to 17.



Q3. How many people live in your household?

- 80% (372) of people live in households which comprise of 3 or more persons people.
- 16% (74) of respondents live in a two-person household.
- 4% (21) of respondents live in single person households.

Q4. Would you consider yourself to have a disability / reduced mobility / or health problems?

- 9% (40) of respondents state that they have a disability / reduced mobility / or health problems.
- This figure comprised of 25 females and 15 males.

Q5. Do you currently use a community centre?


- 88% (411) of respondents do not use a community centre.
- Of the 12% (58) of respondents that use a community centre, a larger proportion of female respondents (14%) claim to use a centre, compared to male respondents (9%).

Q6. If YES, where?

54 respondents answered this question, with the most popular response being 'Claremont' with 11 people providing this answer. 'Aura' was the next most popular response at 7. Four locations had four responses each; Blackwater Park, Club Active, St. Mary's Community Centre, and Walterstown GAA.


Q7. What is the main purpose of your use?

- Of the 56 respondents who currently use a community centre, 30 of the respondents (54%) use it for 'sports and fitness' purposes.
- The next largest response was for 'youth activities', where 14% of those respondents selected.
- 9% of respondents respectively use it for 'parent and toddler groups' and performing arts'.



Q8. How do you travel to your nearest community centre?


• 93% use a car to get to their nearest community centre.



Q9. How long does it take you to travel to your nearest community centre? 67% answered '10 minutes or longer'.


Q10. If you do not use a community centre, please indicate the reason why?

- Of the 411 respondents that do not use any community centre, the majority of respondents (322) or 85% selected the reason for not using a community centre as 'No centre in my local area'.
- 4% of respondents respectively selected 'Too far away' and 'No suitable activities'.



Q11. What type of facilities would you like to see in your community? (select up to 3 options)

The facility type that received the highest total of selections was a playground, with 271 people choosing it. A youth centre was the next largest selection, with 234 votes. Health and fitness, sporting amenity (indoor), and family activity were the next highest with similar scores of 220, 215, and 209 respectively.



Q12. When would you anticipate using community facilities the most?

The most popular time respondents selected as being their preferred time of use for such a facility was weekday evenings, with almost half of all respondents selecting this time. The next highest selection was for weekends, which received 28% of the vote.

Q13. Would you be interested in volunteering at your local community centre, and if so, how?

Results for this poll were more evenly spread. Of those interested in volunteering, a slight majority (13%) favoured reception duties, with 12% of people offering to help organise community events.










Q9. How long does it take you to travel to your nearest community centre?












