Just a reminder to all that the new closing date of **Thursday August 20<sup>th</sup> 2020 at 1pm** for the following schemes is approaching;

- Annual Arts Grants Scheme
- Community Arts Award
- Festival Grant Scheme
- Professional Artists Development Fund
- Tyrone Guthrie Centre Regional Bursary Award

And **Thursday September 24<sup>th</sup> 2020 at 1pm** for the School Musical Instrument Purchase Scheme.

Unfortunately there will be no Drama League of Ireland Bursary awards this year as the DLI Summer School has been cancelled due to Covid19.

# Local Writer selected for Words Ireland's National Mentoring Programme

The Arts Office are pleased to announce local writer Angela Lyons as the Meath recipient of the 2020 Words Ireland National Mentoring Award. Supported by the Arts Office, Angela has been selected by Words Ireland to receive professional literary mentoring over the next eight months from an acclaimed Irish writer of her choice.

This award, funded by the Arts Office in a new exciting partnership with Words Ireland, will ensure that the chosen mentee receives this potentially life-changing support for free. It is also an investment in the long-term literary reputation of the region.

The mentoring process involves four two-hour meetings between the selected 'mentee' and their chosen professional writer. The mentor reads up to 10,000 words of the awarded mentee's writing in advance of each, then shares their hardearned critical feedback and advice. It's a form of peer to peer teaching that is increasingly popular across all sectors of Irish life – in industry as well as the arts.

The mentoring programme is managed by Words Ireland, and, following a national call out, a total of 24 writers were selected from 250 applicants.

A native of West Cork, Angela Lyons has been living in Co. Meath for the past 25 years. She is a primary school teacher and currently finishing her M.A. in Creative Writing in DCU.

Angela has been shortlisted for many awards including the Frances McManus Award on RTE Radio on several occasions and has won the Bryan MacMahon Short Story Award at Listowel Writers Week, 2020. She has also written several plays which have been performed locally. Currently she is working on a book of short stories.
