Welcome to the Spring edition of the Arts Office Newsletter.

As the days get longer and the evenings brighter, a much welcomed sense of hope fills the fresh spring air. Hope of better times to come for all. To accompany this season of purposeful growth and renewal, the Arts Office is delighted to announce the launch of its Spring 2021 Funding Cycle which sees the commencement of 5 individual grant and bursary competitions.

Included are 3 previously operated grant streams : **The Professional Artists Development Fund, The Annual Arts Grant and the Festivals Grant Scheme**, and 2 newly introduced Covid-19 response schemes: **The Arts Sector CPD Fund** and the **Digital Equipment Purchase Scheme**.

This group of funding opportunities form part of a larger suite of artists supports administered through the arts office. Supports which this year have been strengthened by additional funding received from the Arts Council of Ireland and Creative Ireland. The Spring Funding Cycle aims to cover a wide range of disciplines, arts practices and activities and is intended to enable artists to continue developing their work and projects throughout the current public health restrictions. It also aims to assist arts communities, groups and organisations adapt to meet the demands of this new environment.

In addition to adding new streams of funding, Meath Arts Office has moved the entire application process online for 2021. Inviting applicants to complete forms electronically and submit applications and support materials digitally, it eliminates the need for printing and posting and reduces risk and work for the applicant.

SPOTLIGHT ON PUBLIC ART : The Family by Maurice Harron



The Family by Maurice Harron

The Family by Maurice Harron is a remarkable group of five stainless steel figures situated in Duleek Village.

Funded by Indaver under the Meath County Council Private Developer Public Art Scheme, this 4.5 meter-high sculpture features two adults and three children, happily walking hand in hand.

The sculpture consists of hundreds of rectangular and square pieces of stainless steel, assembled irregularly. *The Family* glitters and shimmers day and night, thanks to a dedicated LED lighting system embedded around the basement of the artwork.

A beautiful art piece not to be missed when in Duleek.

Annual Arts Grants Scheme

This award is intended to support **organisations, groups or individuals** in the provision of **local arts activities** which **enhance long-term development and sustainability** of the arts in County Meath.



Festival Grant Scheme

This award is intended to support **arts festivals** taking place in County Meath that show a commitment to **quality artistic programming**.



Professional Artists Development Fund

This award is intended to support Meath based **professional arts practitioners** in the development of their **artistic practice** and/or the **development of new work**.



Digital Equipment Purchase Scheme

This award is intended to support **individual artists, arts organisations or arts groups** in the purchasing of **ICT equipment** to enhance the **digital capability of arts practices** in County Meath.



Arts Sector CPD Fund

This award is intended to support Meath based professionals within the **arts sector** in their **continued professional development**.

SCRIPTS Call for Playwrights 2021



SCRIPTS: Ireland's Playwriting Festival seeks new works for stage to inspire and incite.

Playwrights (both established and emerging) are invited to submit original 15 minute plays on the theme "Emergence."

Deadline for submissions is **Friday 5 March 2021, 5pm.**

Taking place in Birr, Co Offaly, Scripts Ireland's Playwriting Festival creates unique opportunities for playwrights to have their work developed and produced. Three scripts most suited for development, will be selected through a rigorous shortlisting process.

The selected playwrights will then receive a week of mentoring and script development under the guidance of Playwright and screenwriter Eugene O'Brien, where the whole process of writing and rewriting will be explored in a collaborative supportive environment.

The festival will support three playwrights with a team of artists to mentor, develop and produce the emerging scripts for a rehearsed reading of the new works at the festival finale. Industry professionals will then judge the final versions and a winner will be selected.

Percent for Art Commissions

Percent for Art Commission, Coláiste Chú Chulainn, Marshes Lower Dundalk Co. Louth.



Open to all interested professional artists of any career stage or experience. This is a staged process and no designs or detailed proposals are required in Stage 1.

Stage 1—Artists are invited to express their interest in being considered for this project at the first stage of the commission. Artists may do this by completing the application form and submission of a CV and images / details of recent relevant works / projects.

The closing date for receipt of Stage 1 completed application form together with supporting documentation and material is **12 noon Friday 2nd April, 2021** and must be emailed to rinawhyte@yahoo.com

Stage 2 - From the completed Stage 1 applications; a shortlist of artists will be selected by panel jury. This panel, whose decision is final, has the right to clarify any issue which may arise in the course of selection. Stage 2 short listed artists will be paid a concept development fee of €300 to work on a detailed proposal for final selection. A Stage 2 brief will be available to shortlisted artists and a site visit is expected at this stage.




