To accompany this season of purposeful growth and renewal, the Arts Office is delighted to announce the launch of its Spring 2022 Funding Cycle which sees the commencement of five individual grant and bursary competitions: The Annual Arts Grant, the Community Arts Grant, the Festivals Grant Scheme, the Drama League of Ireland Bursary and The Professional Artists Development Fund. We are also delighted to announce that we will be participating in Platform31 once again in 2022. This initiative is a collaboration between the Association of Local Authority Arts Officers and the Arts Council and is a national opportunity for artists to develop their practice and test new ideas.

This group of funding opportunities form part of a larger suite of artists supports administered through the Arts Office.

Supports which this year have been strengthened by additional funding received from the Arts Council of Ireland and

Creative Ireland. The Spring Funding Cycle aims to cover a wide range of disciplines, arts practices and activities.

The Meath Arts Office entire application process is now online and we invite applicants to complete forms electronically and submit applications and support materials digitally.

SPOTLIGHT ON PUBLIC ART: Equilibrium by Orla de Brí



Equilibrium, by renowned Meath-based sculptor Orla de Brí, is a Bronze and stone sculpture located at Dunshaughlin Civic Offices measuring 2.7 metres by 3.4 meters. Working from her Meath-studio, Orla de Brí is very much a hands-on sculptor, enjoying every aspect of the work, from the concept of the first drawing through to the varied and sometimes challenging physical processes. Her unique, elegantly stylised figures and objects, in a variety of materials, including bronze, steel, stone and fibreglass are familiar to many.

De Brí has had seven major solo shows and has completed 26 site-specific, large-scale public sculptures in Ireland, London and Istanbul. Be sure to keep an eye out for this exquisite piece of sculpture when visiting Dunshaughlin.

Annual Arts Grants Scheme

This award is intended to support **organisations**, **groups or individuals** in the provision of **local arts activities** which **enhance long-term development and sustainability** of the arts in County Meath.



Community Arts Grant

This award is intended to support **community groups** and **schools** in the provision of **community arts projects** which **promote engagement** and **enhance long-term partnerships** with professional artists.



Festival Grant Scheme

This award is intended to support **arts festivals** taking place in County Meath which show a commitment to **quality artistic programming.**



Drama League of Ireland Bursary

This bursary is intended to fund a **week-log residential stay** at the **Drama League of Ireland Summer School** at the University of Limerick. The residency is open to directors, designers and actors working in theatre, living in County Meath.



Professional Artist Development Fund

This award is intended to support Meath based **professional arts practitioners** in the development of their **artistic practice** and/or the **development of new work.**

Meath County Council Arts Office announces its participation in PLATFORM31

Following on from its successful pilot in 2020-21, the Association of Local Authority Arts Officers (ALAAO) is once more collaborating with the Arts Council to present PLATFORM 31 – a national opportunity for artists to be supported to investigate how they might develop their practice or make work in a different way.

Designed to support and enable career development for 31 mid-career artists - one artist will be selected from each of the 31 local authorities around Ireland - there are two elements of support for participating artists in this pilot scheme: financial and developmental.

Participating artists will receive an €8,000 bursary to invest in themselves and their practice, combined with participation in a developmental programme.

Informed by last year's pilot, the PLATFORM 31 developmental programme will provide coaching, advisory support and networking opportunities for participating artists, introducing them to a pool of critical thinkers to share their work and encouraging a national conversation about creating work in local contexts.

Applications open from March 3rd to March 30th 2022.

Former MCC Writer in Residence Oisín McGann was selected to represent Meath in the Platform 31 initiative in 2021.

Oisín McGann is an Irish writer and illustrator. He writes in a range of genres for children and teenagers, mainly science fiction and fantasy, and has illustrated many of his own short story books for younger readers.

PLATFORM 31 is managed by Wicklow County Council on behalf of The Association of Local Authority Arts Officers, in collaboration with the Arts Council.

Meath County Council Arts Office is delighted to welcome Fishamble Theatre Company to Meath with the world premiere of *OUTRAGE* by award winning playwright Deirdre Kinahan. Commissioned by Meath Arts Office & produced by Fishamble *OUTRAGE* is a theatrical hurricane of empathy, action and truth live in Kells Courthouse from Thursday 17 March.

Following the story of two sisters, OUTRAGE is a play that explores the true nature of women's role in the Irish revolutionary wars and in particular the Civil War in 1922.

Alice and Nell play key roles in organising civic resistance and the propaganda war. They are fervent, they are funny, they are human and they - like everyone else in Ireland - become deeply conflicted as the country spins toward a shattering Civil clash that split the nation, and continues to haunt Irish politics, society and culture to this day.

OUTRAGE, by Deirdre Kinahan, commissioned by Meath Arts Office, produced by Fishamble and directed by Jim Culleton will premiere during St Patrick's Festival in the Kells Courthouse and Pumphouse in Dublin Port. This production follows Fishamble's other recent work during the Decade of Centenaries – *Inside the GPO* in 2016, *Embargo* in 2020, and *The Treaty* in 2021. Performed by Caitríona Ennis, Mary Murray & Naoise Dunbar with design team of Maree Kearns, Kevin Smith, Carl Kennedy & Catherine Fay.

Supported by the Arts Council, Dublin Port Company, and **Meath Arts Office** with assistance from the DTCAGSM under the Decade of Centenaries 2012 - 2023 initiative and Meath LLPPS3. The performance on the 18th will be followed by a post-show discussion with Playwright Deirdre Kinahan, Director Jim Culleton & County Arts Officer Gerardette Bailey (8.45 – 9.30pm)

In Case You Missed it.....

HARK! A Kell's Christmas Carol produced by **Sofft Productions** in association with **Meath Arts Office** and presented under the DTCAGSM Local Live Performance Programming Scheme 2 took place in **Kells Theatre (St Vincent de Paul Hall), Kells, Co. Meath on Saturday, 18th December 2021.** The show kicked off at 8PM with patrons welcomed by **Kells Silver Band**.







This **Meath Arts** initiative provided a platform for **Meath Artists to showcase** their work to a live concert audience. MC for the evening, Comedian **Fred Cooke** delivered a unique brand of comedy through his musical prowess, physical storytelling and warm, affable stage presence.

HARK! Welcomed traditional music legend **Paddy Keenan**, hailing from one of the most influential bands of the 1970s, **The Bothy Band**. **The Bothy Band** forever changed the face of Irish traditional music, merging a driving rhythm section with traditional Irish tunes in ways that had never been heard before. Since then, Paddy pursued a **solo career**, bringing traditional music to audiences globally across Japan, Europe, Australia, and North America.

Paddy Smith Band then performed with **Jeanne McGovern**, whether he's performing blues standards or his own original material that's informed by his experiences, Paddy Smith blew the blues.

Joining the stage was singer-songwriter **Robert John Ardiff**, best known for his work in The Choice Music Prize nominated band Come On Live Long. His solo music has had millions of streams on Spotify and has featured on the Amazon original TV series, Modern Love. Robert John Ardiff's HARK! Celtic Tenor **Matthew Gilsenan** performed with renowned vocalist **Deirdre Shannon. Matthew** was born and raised in Co. Meath, commandeered from the age of 7 to sing solo at many larger parish occasions and it went from there. Readoiri, Scor na nOg, and later feis ceoil were staples for Matthew where he won many National accolades. Matt studied engineering at UCD, but also, in the evenings, studied singing at the College of Music at Chatham row and Adelaide road. Matt engineered for 5 years or so but then got an opportunity to create the Celtic Tenors with two colleagues.

Deirdre has one of the purest voices around which is evident whether she is singing a traditional Irish song or something classical. She was invited to join the big box office hit **Celtic Woman.** Deirdre toured the USA as soloist in the successful show and it was here Deirdre earned both a gold and platinum disc from EMI Manhattan.






Ireland's favourite circus also came to town - **Circus Gerbola** the unique, diverse and entertaining show that combines traditional circus with ultra modern lighting, dancing, and special effects, locally based in Navan. **The Gerbola family** specialises in clowning and goes back eight generations.

Award-winning playwright and a member of Aosdána, Ireland's elected body of outstanding artists, **Deirdre Kinahan** performed a written piece that tells a story that celebrates music and gathering, accompanied by a string section. Deirdre is an Associate Artist with Meath County Council Arts Office. Her plays are translated into many languages, published by **Nick Hern Books** and produced regularly in Ireland and on the international stage.

Film lovers also enjoyed a 15-minute film premier of *All Rise*: A musical short film shot on site in Kells historic courthouse showcasing music acts from Meath with support under the **Meath LLPPS 2**.







All Rise: The Kells Courthouse Sessions

Filmed in association with Meath Arts Office and Sofft Productions, **All Rise; The Courthouse Sessions** was part of the Meath LLPPS 2 scheme and premiered on the Hot Press YouTube channel on 18 December 2021.

All Rise: The Kells Courthouse Sessions is a celebration of musicians, artists and the magic of the creative space. Shot on location at Kells Courthouse; a cultural hub in the heart of Co. Meath, is a three part series featuring both Meath legends like Paddy Keenan and Jimmy Smyth to up and coming talent like Paper Clap Sound and Kollective.



Episode 1 in a series of three All Rise sessions included memorable performances by ace uilleann piper Paddy Keenan, who originally came to prominence with The Bothy Band; Kollective; Deirdre Kinahan; Jimmy Smyth with Karrie O'Sullivan, among others and is available to view here.

Episode 2 once again provided a platform for Meath artists to showcase and document new work in the historic setting of Kells Courthouse – with appearances from Deirdre Kinahan, Atelica, Tommy Keyes, IF and JJ Bloom and is available to view here.

SCRIPTS, Ireland's Playwriting Festival is seeking new works for the stage



Scripts, Ireland's Playwriting Festival is seeking new plays to inspire and incite. The theme for 2022 is **ESCAPE.**

Whether it's finding sweet escape or clawing fingernails to avert imminent danger, what does it mean to break free from confinement or control?

Circumstances, relationships, mask restrictions, jobs, judgement, relentless worry, fear - what do you want to escape from? We're looking for characters with the pressure cooker turned up, actively making a change to their lives.

From the minute to the immense, can you take on this theme and write an affecting 15-minute contemporary drama?

Taking place in Birr, Co Offaly from 14-17 July, Scripts creates unique opportunities for playwrights to have their work developed and produced.

Three scripts most suited for development will be selected through a rigorous shortlisting process.

These selected playwrights then receive a week of mentoring and script development under the guidance of Playwright and Screenwriter **Eugene O'Brien**, where the whole process of writing and rewriting is explored in a collaborative supportive environment.

The festival supports three playwrights with a team of artists to mentor, develop and produce the emerging scripts for a rehearsed reading, directed by Jim Culleton of Fishamble. Industry professionals then judge the final versions and a winner is selected.

Playwrights (both established and emerging) are invited to submit original 15-minute plays on the theme "ESCAPE."

Deadline for submissions is Monday 14 March 2022, 5pm.
