OF PERAS AND APEIRON: ends and infinity

The first appearance of the Greek term *Apeiron* is attributed to Anaximander of Miletus (sixth century BCE) combining the term "a" (without) and Peras (finite). *Of Peras and Apeiron* explores numerical, geometrical and methodical art making systems by artists who are both incessantly freed by the potential of infinity whilst being bound by limits. Halsall/ Quirke correlate inherent systematic processes of art practice within this group exhibition and reveal approaches that are mathematical and rational, fictional and personal whilst exploring the deep creativity of systems made by humans and other agents.

Anthropocene, an exhibition of work by artist David Thomas Smith, will run concurrently in our Café Gallery alongside Of Peras and Apeiron in our Level 3 Gallery. Visit our website to find out more.

SURVEYOR 2025

Curated by Patrick Murphy

Inviting artists living in or from County Meath or County Louth to submit works of all disciplines, Solstice Arts Centre, in collaboration with North East Network, is delighted to announce the fourteenth SURVEYOR open exhibition. Supporting, valuing, and encouraging artists in the development of their practices and creative careers, the exhibition presents an overview of contemporary visual arts practice throughout the two counties.

This year, Solstice partners with fellow North East Network members, Droichead Arts Centre in Drogheda, and An Táin Arts Centre in Dundalk, in a unique extension of its annual selected survey of local professional arts practice.

SURVEYOR 2025 will simultaneously open at Solstice Arts Centre, Droichead Arts Centre, and An Táin Arts Centre, showcasing the work of artists from the northeast of the country. Artists living in or from Co. Meath or Co. Louth are welcome to apply to any of the three participating venues, though they must choose just one venue when ultimately submitting their work. There will be a visual arts award of €2,000 selected by each curator in each arts centre.

This year, Patrick Murphy, Director of the Royal Hibernian Academy of Arts, will select the work at Solstice Arts Centre. Solstice will continue its Solstice Visual Arts Award of €2,000 and is pleased to announce, on the eve of its 20th birthday year, the establishment of two new awards for Meath artists: Meath County Council Arts Office Going Solo Award 2025 to the value of €2,000, and the Newgrange Gold Award, also to the value of €2,000.






