Create and NCAD offer Co-Create PhD

Deadline: 26 February, 5pm

The National College of Art and Design, Belfast School of Art, Ulster University, the University of Limerick and Atlantic Technological University invite applications for funded PhD studentships as part of Co-Create Ireland: Art and Design Research Network for Inclusive Futures (CO-CREATE), a €4m cross border research project supported by the Higher Education Authority's North South Research Programme. 8 funded PhDs opportunities are being advertised across the network.

AIC Case Study: Tactile Tunes, Jane Cassidy and members of Arts Alive

Tactile Tunes was led by Jane Cassidy in collaboration with Arts Alive, a Galway City based community group of ten adults with intellectual disabilities under the Brothers of Charity Services Ireland. The project culminated in an interactive exhibition in the Aula Maxima at the University of Galway for the Galway International Arts Festival 2025. Combining sound and sculpture, the exhibition explored how tactile, touch-sensitive instruments could make music-making intuitive and accessible for all. The result was an ambitious and imaginative exhibition that placed inclusivity and creativity at its core.

Tactile Tunes was funded by the Arts Council's Artist in the Community Scheme Project Realisation Award, managed by Create.
