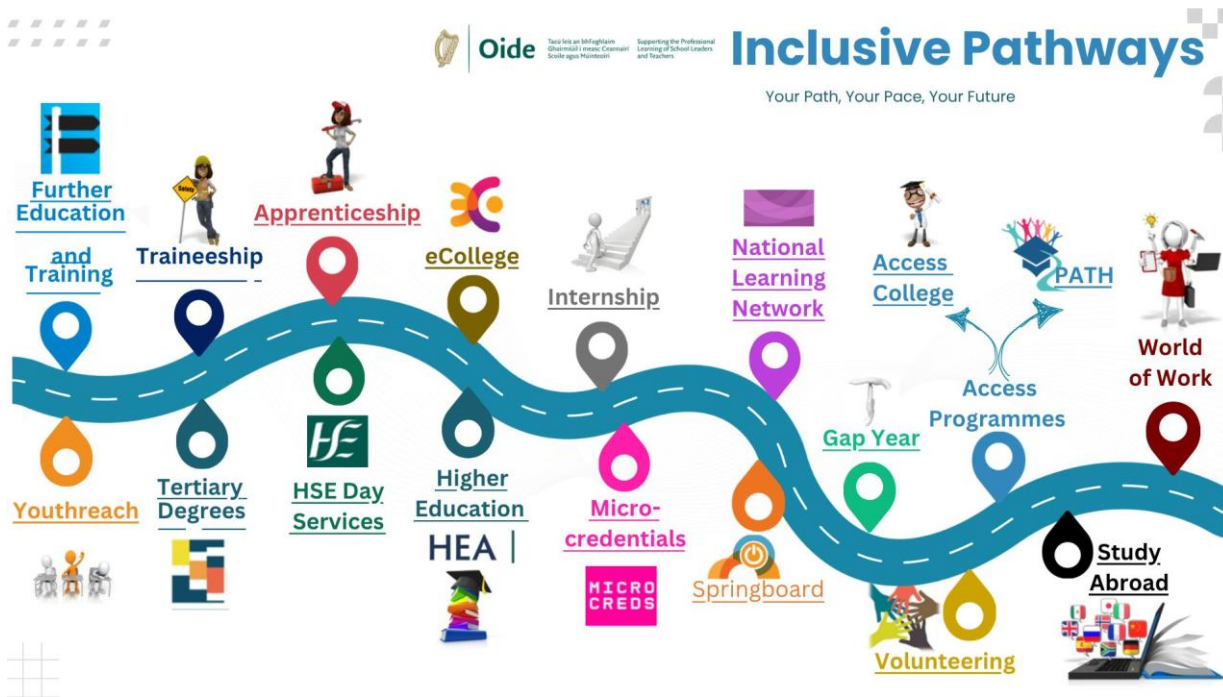

- **Create your own Book Club** - This is a course that helps learners structure a book club for their community group. Groups will choose a book(s) to read and will be guided as to how to explore themes, share opinions and develop a regular reading habit.

- **Memoir Writing** - This is a course to develop your writing skills so that you can write and record stories from your life for your children or grandchildren. The course helps you craft each event or story so that it can be kept in written form or for use as a basis to create your own video recordings. This course is suitable for anyone who wishes to create a legacy of their life, and learning, to be passed on to those they love.

QQI Level 3

- **Personal Effectiveness and Interpersonal Skills** -

Are you interested in personality psychology and relationship psychology? This module gives you the opportunity to create a personal profile, helping you to identify your likes and dislikes, values, strengths and identifying what has shaped you as a person. You will also create a case book of tools for dealing with others. This includes Conflict Management, Decision Making, Assertiveness, Negotiation Skills and emotional regulation techniques. Better relationships with others and yourself makes for happier healthier groups and people. Knowing what tool to use, when and where, will be an invaluable asset to any community group.

2. Meet the eligibility criteria

- Be at least 17 years old
- Have achieved a passing grade (O6H/H7) in 5 or more subjects (to include Maths and English) at Ordinary Level in the Leaving Certificate **OR**
- A full QQI Level 5 or higher qualification or equivalent.



3. Register as an apprentice

Once employed, your employer must register you with the relevant ETB / SOLAS within the first two weeks of your employment.



4. Alternate learning phases

Your training will alternate between on-the-job work at the employer and off-the-job study in a training centre.



5. Assessment and progression

You will be assessed through modular coursework, practical assessments, and workplace competence assessments.
